NHS Pharmacy First Service-

The NHS Pharmacy First Service enables children and adults to get convenient access to healthcare advice and treatment where appropriate, for seven common conditions, without the potential delay of having to wait for a GP appointment.

There is no need to make an appointment, you are able to pop into the local Boots pharmacy with your child and ask for help under the service.

Support for the following conditions can be accessed under the service, free of charge (unless NHS prescription charges apply):

- Earache (aged 1 to 17 years)
- Impetigo (aged 1 year and over)
- Infected insect bites and stings (aged 1 year and over)
- Sore throats (aged 5 years and over)
- Sinusitis (aged 12 years and over)
- Uncomplicated urinary tract infections (UTIs) in women (aged 16 to 64 years)
- Shingles (aged 18 years and over)

Pensioner Just Missing Out Scheme-

The Pensioner Just Missing Out scheme supports Kent pensioners in need of help with significantly rising living costs. This is something that could be shared with relatives or neighbours to provide further support for them.

The scheme is available for pension-aged residents on lower incomes who are not eligible for Pension Credit or the Government's Winter Fuel Payment.

Please note – an email address will need to be provided and those applying will need to have online access for energy support activation. Food vouchers will not require online activation and can be issued by email or post.

This scheme provides eligible residents with £200 towards energy, food, or both. **The scheme will close on 28 February 2025, or when all funds are spent.**
