Dear Parents/Carers.

Welcome back to the start of Term 1. I hope that you all had a wonderful break and that the children were excited to return to school to continue their learning journey and see their friends and ASPIRE staff.

Kent Test-

Those Year 6 pupils who have already been submitted by parents/carers back in June/July, will be taking the Kent Test **next Thursday 12th September.**

Each pupil takes the test in their own school, under assessment conditions. The test is carried out by two or more members of staff, where on some occasions, a visiting member of staff from another school within the local area may swap to invigilate on the day to ensure compliance, this is always led by KCC.

The Paper-

There are three tests – English, Maths and Reasoning, taken on one day. Children also complete a 40-minute writing task, which is not marked.

The tests are in multiple-choice format. Children's answer sheets are marked by a computer, to a high level of accuracy.

The first test will be an English and Maths paper and will take 1 hour. Each section will involve a 5 minute practice exercise followed by a 25 minute test.

The English section will involve a comprehension exercise as well as some additional questions to test literacy skills.

The third test will be a Reasoning paper (verbal and non-verbal). It will take about 1 hour, including the practice sections and questions. It will contain a verbal reasoning section and a non-verbal reasoning section of roughly the same length.

There will also be a writing exercise which will take place either in the afternoon, or directly after the first three tests, depending on how the individual school decides to do this. This is also carried out in assessment conditions. 40 minutes will be allowed for the writing task, including 10 minutes planning time. The writing task is not marked but may be used in an appeals panel as part of the headteacher assessment stage of the process - which takes place at the end of September.

Results-

The assessment results will be sent on Thursday 17th October 2024 after 4pm. These can only be emailed to the email address you supplied when registering your child. If your child receives a 'G', this means Grammar and if your child receives a 'H', this indicates High School.


On the Day-
